What safeguarding means

Safeguarding means protecting children from abuse, neglect, exploitation and harm. It also means helping children get support early and creating safe learning environments.

Who is responsible?

Everyone. All staff, governors, volunteers, trustees and contractors have a duty to protect children and report concerns.

The role of the DSL

The Designated Safeguarding Lead manages safeguarding concerns, supports staff, liaises with agencies and makes referrals when needed.

Staff training

All staff receive safeguarding training at least annually. New staff receive safeguarding induction and regular updates throughout the year.

Reporting concerns

Any concern about a child must be passed to the DSL immediately. Staff should never assume someone else has reported it.

Information sharing

Share information when it is necessary to keep a child safe. Do not promise confidentiality to children. Record decisions accurately.

Supporting children

Schools provide pastoral support, safeguarding support, mental health support, early help and referrals to external agencies.

Supporting staff

Staff involved in safeguarding cases can access supervision, advice and wellbeing support.

Online safety

Children are taught online safety. Staff must report concerns about cyberbullying, grooming, exploitation, extremist content or inappropriate online behaviour.

Mental health

Mental health difficulties may indicate safeguarding concerns. Report concerns about self-harm, suicide risk, eating disorders or significant emotional distress.

Private fostering

Any private fostering arrangement must be reported so that the local authority can check the child is safe.

Alternative provision

Schools remain responsible for safeguarding pupils placed in alternative provision and must monitor attendance and welfare.

Looked After Children

Looked After Children, previously looked after children and children with social workers may need additional support and monitoring.

SEND

Children with SEND can face additional safeguarding risks. Staff should be alert to communication barriers and individual needs.

Attendance

Poor attendance, repeated absence and children missing education may be indicators of harm and must be investigated.

Prevent

Schools have a duty to identify and respond to concerns about radicalisation and extremism.

Professional boundaries

Staff must follow the code of conduct and maintain professional relationships with pupils.

Reasonable force

Reasonable force may only be used to prevent injury, serious disruption or damage, and must always be proportionate.

Safer recruitment

Appropriate recruitment checks including DBS checks are carried out on relevant adults working with children.

Visitors

Visitors are supervised and receive safeguarding information when attending school sites.

Handling disclosures

Listen, stay calm, do not investigate, record facts, explain information may need to be shared, and report concerns immediately.

Referrals

The DSL may seek advice, make Early Help referrals, contact social care or involve the police where necessary.

Allegations against staff

Concerns about adults working with children must be reported immediately and may require involvement from the LADO.

Child-on-child abuse

Includes bullying, sexual harassment, sexual violence, abuse in relationships, online abuse, harmful sexual behaviour and exploitation.

Sexual harassment and violence

All reports are taken seriously. Victims are supported and risk assessments completed.

Types of abuse

Staff must understand physical abuse, emotional abuse, sexual abuse and neglect, as well as exploitation, domestic abuse, FGM, forced marriage and radicalisation.

Key message

If you are worried about a child, report it immediately. Safeguarding is everyone's responsibility.
